

Council met in **REGULAR SESSION** on Monday, November 28, 2016, at 7:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers with President Maurer presiding. Members present: Angeloff, Coburn, Debevec, Megyes, Palmer, Soyars, and Conrad-Wokojance. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited and Mr. Soyars gave the Invocation. President Maurer asked for a moment of silence for Tom Casale who passed away over the weekend. He was a reserve officer for the City of Barberton for over 31 years.

It was moved by Mr. Soyars, seconded by Mrs. Debevec, to approve the Minutes of the Regular Legislative Session held on Monday, November 14, 2016, as presented. All Members voted “yea.” Motion carried.

PETITIONS AND CLAIMS

MATTERS REFERRED

Each Council Member, the Mayor and Service Director were given a report prepared by the Council Clerk listing all matters before all committees.

CITIZENS ADDRESSING COUNCIL

The following Minutes are not transcribed verbatim. This meeting has been recorded in its entirety and the tape is catalogued in the Clerk of Council’s office.

Terri Heckman, CEO of the Battered Women’s Shelter. She said she was there to speak about the draft of the ordinance that is being read tonight whereby they would add domestic disturbance to the nuisance laws. She said she would like to ask for this to be reconsidered with the words “domestic dispute and violence” in the passage they are looking at. She said she has been there for 20 years and she can’t tell them the number of times that people have had 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 9 times to the same address before either the family decides to get help and separate so they can get that help or before one of them dies. She stated it is a cycle, it is part of the cycle of domestic disputes which domestic disputes is on a continuum of domestic violence. She said when a domestic dispute becomes a domestic violence - if you knew that you could put her out of business and she would be happy for that. She said she absolutely understands where they are coming from with this resolution because in her 20 years at the shelter they have seen the same people come through the doors many times. She said she also knows that it has taken some of them 8, 9, 10, 12, 15 times before they leave and sometimes it is because the birth of a child. Ms. Heckman stated sometimes it is because the child gets involved in the domestic violence or domestic dispute. She said sometimes it is because they have been through the police department numerous times or the police department has been to their house numerous times and every time they have learned a tiny bit more along the way to being able to leave. She said she read on that day the number one police killing happens at domestic dispute calls. She stated it is definitely a dangerous situation for our officers to be going out and that is why this has more power than some of the other parts of this resolution that they are looking at. She said the police are encouraged to figure out who started the fight and encouraged to arrest and they have to document if they are not arresting and why they are not arresting one of the parties. She stated it

is handled as very seriously at all levels. She said she knows the jails are full so it is hard to saylet's just decide on the first, second, or third call who should be arrested, who is the primary aggressor and who is the victim that needs the help. She stated these are complicated cases and she will tell them they work with the Akron police all the time and they are trying to get the 25 times at the same address down to 15 times at the same address. She said they are trying to move the needle somewhat by offering services at a much earlier state. She said she would like to encourage them to really consider the power that this could give to an offender to be able to use "you cannot call the police, you know what is going to happen, our apartment is going to go into foreclosure, our landlord is going to kick us out because of this, this is going to cost us money because we have called multiple times in the past year." She said this just provides more power to the person who is already using power and control against an individual. She stated she thinks there is multiple reasons for it. She said she is going to leave them with two thoughts, one the Bureau of Justice Crime data brief said there is an average of 35 times before a person is hit before the police are called once. She said this isn't something that it is one time and it is over. She stated these are the most complex cases that their police department will ever deal with and so she encourages them to think about that and she also wants to remind them that on most of the calls they get that are covered by this resolution, fireworks, dogs barking, rowdy college kids having parties every week, in none of those situations are the outcome that somebody can die if they guess wrong. She said this one is much more serious than those and she is sure that the officers are well aware of that and she is sure it is not being taken lightly. She stated she would like to ask to consider the possibility, and she is not sure if this is possible or not, of studying this for 90 days or 120 days. She said she would volunteer herself as an expert in Summit County to be on any kind of committee to study it and say what are other places doing that have this tremendous problem and how can we provide our officers with some relief to this repetitive calls and how can we offer our citizens earlier intervention programs, getting her agency into these frequent flier families, if they would like to call them that, earlier in the situation but she thinks before they are in a situation where they are standing there defending an allegation that they somehow participated in someone's death because it was the 4th or 5th time and they are now throwing them at them she would like to encourage them and offer herself to study this and try to come up what is in the best interest of everyone. She said if the resolution is the way this goes she too will support whatever they need to do as a council and with the police department, she will support them 100% but she would like to stand back and become a part of this before they enact a resolution. President Maurer asked if she had a business card. Ms. Heckman stated she had one in her car. President Maurer said he would like to forward this to our law director and that she has asked for the one reading tonight. He said they are going to put this on a slow walk until they get the bugs worked out. He stated they certainly want to make sure a person cannot feel like they can call the police for fear of losing their home. Mr. Soyars asked if she could attend the following Monday's Safety Committee at 6:00 pm in the Small Court Room. She stated she could.

President Maurer stated they are going to take things a little out of sequence.

She said he spent many, many hours at her house especially at suppertime. She stated she is so proud of what Tony has accomplished on and off the field. *She looked at the football players and said she hopes they understand that.* She stated back in 1991 her son and Mr. Palmer's son played with Mr. Gotto and they went to the playoffs. She said Mr. Pasarelli was there at that time too. She said there is a lot of history. She told the boys that winning is great, everyone wants to win but it is what you do off the field and this is what their coach and other coaches have taught them. She said they taught them to honor, have discipline - lots of discipline especially when it is 95 degrees out and you have your uniform on and you have to practice, respect and the number one thing is community pride. She stated they could thank Mr. Megyes for that. She said to see the boys out there doing community work is a big deal. She stated she knows it helps on their resumes when they go to college but to people seeing these young boys doing this on their own time, that is a real plus. Mrs. Angeloff told the coaches and the team "Thank you for such a wonderful year, she enjoyed every game." She congratulated Coach Gotto for Division II Coach of the Year. Mr. Megyes congratulated them on a great season. He said winning is fun, it is a lot better than the alternative – look at the Cleveland Browns. He stated winning is a state of mind, knowing you can do something and thinking positive. He said that is what Coach Gotto and the coaching staff instills in their brain – to just be positive all the time. He stated winning is exciting and what they did is they brought back the excitement to Barberton Football. He said he saw something he hasn't seen, he can't remember, he saw both sides of the stadium full. He stated he saw people waiting to buy tickets 40 yards long. He said he hasn't seen that in a long time and that is great. He said another thing he would like to talk about is how they give back to the community. Mr. Megyes stated some of the boys started with the cleanups in 7th and 8th grade and they have been doing it since. He said you wouldn't believe how the people, especially with the raking of the yards- they really, really appreciate it. He said he really appreciates it too. He wished them good luck next year and all the years to come. Mayor Judge congratulated them on a terrific season. He stated all of their hard work did pay off. He stated it may have felt like it was not going to at the time but whether it is in the classroom, on the field, in the weight room or in the community, it paid off. He said giving back to the community is huge and he does not know how much money Mr. Megyes has spent on hamburgers and pizza over the years but quite a bit. He stated he is a big advocate for any extracurricular activities and sports. He said they teach you dedication, hard work, and

winning and losing. He said they teach you a lot of those lessons that are going to follow you the rest of your life so if there are any seniors, good luck in the future with everything you do and take those life lessons with you. He stated underclassmen, you know what is in store, you should be at the weight room right now. He said the coaches are very dedicated and he has known two of them for a long time. He said to Coach Pasarelli - he saw some excitement in him. He said when he was in high school and Coach Pasarelli was coaching you thought he was going to put the pads on or he may have run out there without the pads and still played. He stated he saw that this past year. He said he has known Coach Gotto since elementary school playing for the Woodford Warriors and what he has brought back to this community and made these guys believe in. He said the coaching is great and he has done a great job but the coaches can only do so much and the boys put in the time, the hard work and he applauds their effort and can't wait until next season. He told them congratulations. President Maurer thanked them and said everyone is proud of them. All Members voted "yea." Motion carried.

It was moved by Mrs. Debevec, seconded by Mr. Soyars to excuse Mrs. Frey from tonight's proceedings. All Members said "aye." Motion carried.

President Maurer told department heads that all legislation requests are due by Friday, December 2nd. He said it looks like we are getting ready to wrap things up and we have moved around as much money as we are going to so it should get pretty slow. He told the council they have done a wonderful job for the city and hopefully we are going to have a great year going forward as well. He stated there are 3 meetings left in 2016.

COMMUNICATION FROM THE MAYOR

Mayor Judge said prayers to the family of Officer Tom Casale and also to the students/faculty and the families at Ohio State.

Mayor Judge stated he had a meeting on that day with about 25 different groups, all of a bunch of non-profits and different agencies in town that provide different services and programs to Barberton residents. He said they are opening up the lines of communications. He stated they all work together and they sharing schedules, looking at collaborating different programs and

services and helping them get the services out. He stated they talked about where the City is going in the next few years and enlisting their help through that process. He said it was a very good meeting and they are going to start meeting on a quarterly basis from now on.

Mayor Judge said Alcoa went through a name change. He said they are now Arconic. He said they had a meeting back in November with that announcement and he felt that it would have been in the paper by now. He said there shouldn't be any job loss or any real change except for the name which was what was told to him but he is going to verify. He stated they have a community action committee that he and President Maurer sit on which keeps them informed.

Mayor Judge stated on Thursday, 6:00 at the Salvation Army there will be an Opiate Public Information meeting. He said all are invited and they will take questions from the audience. He said they can write it down on a note card and they will give them to the panelists who's best to address that question.

Mayor Judge said they will not have a Change for Change in the month of December because of the holiday schedule. He said in place they are asking for donations whether it is can goods, money, scarfs, coats, hats and used musical instruments for the Salvation Army. He said they want to put together a musical class and teach kids how to use instruments. He stated they will separate all of the donated items between BACM, Salvation Army and those agencies. He said all donations can be made to his office in the month of December and he asked them to spread the word.

Mayor Judge stated they have a busy month coming up. He said on December 7th the DD Facility on Hopocan Avenue will be renamed in the honor of former Summit County Executive Russ Pry.

Mayor Judge stated the Kent State Urbane Design class has been looking at downtown Barberton. He said they have been meeting and they will have a presentation on December 9th at Kave of the new design for downtown.

Mayor Judge said December 10th is the Greynold's Classic and on that morning he will have open office hours at the city building.
