

RESOLUTION NO. 96-2012

**TITLE: SUBMIT LOAN APPLICATION AND ENTER
WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN FUND
AGREEMENT WITH OHIO EPA
SNYDER AVENUE PUMP STATION**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND ENTER INTO A WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN FUND AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF BARBERTON, WITH THE OHIO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, DIVISION OF ENVIRONMENTAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, AND THE OHIO WATER DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, THROUGH THE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN FUND, FOR PLANNING AND/OR DESIGN OF WASTEWATER FACILITIES AT THE SNYDER AVENUE PUMP STATION; AND DESIGNATING A DEDICATED REPAYMENT SOURCE FOR THE LOAN; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Barberton seeks to upgrade its existing wastewater facilities at the Snyder Avenue Pump Station; and

WHEREAS, the City of Barberton intends to apply for a Water Pollution Control Loan Fund (WPCLF) loan to assist the City of Barberton to pay for the planning and/or design of the wastewater facilities costs to improve the Snyder Avenue Pump Station; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Fund requires the responsible government authority to pass legislation for application for a loan and the execution of an agreement, as well as designation of a repayment source(s).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor, or his designee, be and is hereby authorized to apply for a WPCLF loan, sign all documents for, and enter into a Water Pollution Control Loan Fund Agreement with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Ohio Water Development Authority for planning and/or design of Wastewater Facilities at the Snyder Avenue Pump Station on behalf of the City of Barberton.

SECTION 2. That the Council and Administration of the City of Barberton hereby designate sewer user fee revenue for a dedicated source of repayment to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Environmental and Financial Assistance, through the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund for the subject loan.

SECTION 3. That the Council and Administration of the City of Barberton hereby request that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Environmental and Financial Assistance, through the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund, consider and fund its application for a design loan.

SECTION 4. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 5. That this resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason of the need to meet the funding schedule as established by the Ohio EPA, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
