

ORDINANCE NO. 163-2013

**TITLE: APPROPRIATION – MOVING OHIO FORWARD
PROJECT IMPACT PHASE II**

AN ORDINANCE REDUCING THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT OPERATING BUDGET BY \$37,677, TRANSFERRING \$104,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE PROJECT IMPACT FUND, TRANSFERRING \$76,000 FROM THE RENTAL REGISTRATION PROGRAM FUND TO THE PROJECT IMPACT FUND AND APPROPRIATING \$180,000 FROM THE UNAPPROPRIATED ITEM OF THE PROJECT IMPACT FUND TO THE PROJECT IMPACT OPERATING BUDGET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the sum of Thirty-Seven Thousand, Six Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars and No Cents (\$37,677.00) be reduced from the Building Department Operating Budget, the sum of One Hundred Four Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$104,000.00) be transferred from the General Fund to the Project Impact Fund, the sum of Seventy-Six Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$76,000.00) be transferred from the Rental Registration Program Fund to the Project Impact Fund, and appropriating the sum of One Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$180,000.00) from the Unappropriated Item of the Project Impact Fund to the Project Impact Operating Budget.

SECTION 2. That the Director of Finance is hereby directed to draw his warrants in payment thereof.

SECTION 3. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, in order to transfer these funds as soon as possible, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
