ORDINANCE NO. 169-2014

TITLE: ENTER INTO CONTRACT HEPA ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT, WITH HEPA ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., THE LOWEST AND/OR BEST BIDDER, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$432.00 PER DWELLING FOR THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS AND ABATEMENTS RELATED TO THE DEMOLITION OF 25, MORE OR LESS, RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURES, USING A MIX OF GENERAL FUNDING, CDBG, AND POTENTIAL OTHER GRANT FUNDING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with HEPA Environmental Services, Inc., the lowest and/or best bidder as determined and awarded by the Board of Control, in the amount of Four Hundred Thirty-Two Dollars and No Cents (\$432.00) per dwelling for the Environmental Assessments and Abatements related to the demolition of twenty-five (25), more or less, residential structures, using a mix of General, CDBG, and potential other grant funding.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That Council declares this to be an emergency immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof for the reason in order to execute and utilize this contract at the start of the calendar year, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
