ORDINANCE NO. 197-2013

**TITLE: 2014 RESIDENTIAL DEMOLITION PROGRAM
ENTER INTO CONTRACT – BUTCHER & SON**

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH BUTCHER & SON EXCAVATING, INC., THE LOWEST AND/OR BEST BIDDER, FOR THE 2014 RESIDENTIAL DEMOLITION PROGRAM, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,285 PER DWELLING FOR THE DEMOLITION OF 25, MORE OR LESS, RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURES, USING CDBG, MOF (MOVING OHIO FORWARD), AND GENERAL FUNDING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into contract with Butcher & Son Excavating, Inc., the “lowest and/or best” bidder as determined and awarded by the Board of Control, for the 2014 Residential Demolition Program, in the amount of \$4,285.00 per dwelling for the demolition of twenty-five (25), more or less, residential structures, using CDBG, MOF (Moving Ohio Forward), and General Funding.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, in order to commence with this program at the start of the calendar year, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
