

ORDINANCE NO. 208-2012

**TITLE: ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION & ELIMINATION PROGRAM
CITY OF BARBERTON**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BARBERTON TO ADOPT A BARBERTON ILLICIT DISCHARGE DETECTION & ELIMINATION (IDDE) PROGRAM; AND TO INCLUDE THIS PROGRAM INTO THE BARBERTON CODIFIED ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, an Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination (IDDE) Ordinance is required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to comply with Barberton’s “National Pollution Discharge Elimination System” (NPDES) permit; and

WHEREAS, an IDDE Ordinance will prohibit harmful discharges into the Barberton Municipal Storm Sewer System that discharge into the natural waterways in the City and will provide enforcement and penalties for violations of said Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That this Council hereby adopts the Barberton Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination (IDDE) Ordinance, together with the attachment entitled “Barberton Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination Program,” and to include this program / ordinance into the Barberton Codified Ordinances.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, in order to comply with Barberton’s NPDES permit as soon as possible, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
