# TITLE: AMENDING SECTION 1130 AND SECTION 1360 BARBERTON DEVELOPMENT CODE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1130 "ALLOWABLE USES" AND SECTION 1360 "DEFINITIONS" OF THE BARBERTON DEVELOPMENT CODE.

WHEREAS, at the April 20, 2016 Planning Commission meeting, the Planning Commission requested that City Council amend Section 1130 "Allowable Uses" and Section 1360 "Definitions"; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in Council Chambers on April 25, 2016, regarding the text amendments to Sections 1130 and 1360 of the Barberton Development Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

# CHAPTER 1130 - ALLOWABLE USES

Use Group 11C: Special Retail Office Uses

Special Retail Office Uses are uses that may be compatible with a retail office environment under appropriate conditions. (RESERVED)

Use Group 16: Highway Commercial Uses

Highway Commercial Uses are retail, wholesale, service, and semi-industrial uses that provide goods and services to consumers or businesses, that do not normally require prime consumer retail locations, that require larger sites, that produce greater adverse environmental effects, or are otherwise incompatible with more concentrated or more restricted consumer retail environments and that are therefore suited to free-standing facilities along arterial streets rather than to locations in concentrated consumer retail centers.

#### CHAPTER 1360 – DEFINITIONS

#### 1360.02 Rules and Definitions

## (151) Motor Vehicle:

Any self-propelled wheeled vehicle designed primarily for transportation of persons or goods on public streets. Motor vehicles include automobiles, buses, trucks, motorcycles, self-propelled recreational vehicles (as defined herein), self-propelled farm and construction implements, and both the semi-tractor tractor and trailer portions of tractor trailers. Motor vehicles exclude trains and train ears, aircraft, boats, trailers, go-kart vehicles, motorized golf earts, motorized lawn mowers, commercial trailers, and manufactured homes.

### (154) Motor Vehicle Sales Use:

A premises used for the display, and sale or lease of **five (5) or more** new or used motor vehicles (as defined herein) in a twelve-month period. or recreational vehicles.

## (166) Open Sales Lot:

Open land that is used or occupied primarily for the purpose of displaying motor vehicles, aircraft, boats, lawn tractors, trailers, semi-trailers, go-kart vehicles, motorized golf cars, self-propelled farm and construction implements, commercial trailers, train and train cars, manufactured homes, non-self-propelled recreational vehicles (as defined herein), recreational vehicles, cemetery monuments, nursery plants or supplies, or other merchandise available for sale, lease, exchange, or other distribution. EXCLUDED – Items sold incidentally by a permitted use of the district for not more than seven (7) consecutive days and not having more than five (5) or more items for sale, lease, exchange or other distribution in a twelve month period.

# (201 A) Recreational Vehicle:

A vehicular portable structure that meets all of the following conditions:

- (1) It is designed for the sole purpose of recreational travel.
- (2) It is not used for the purpose of engaging in business for profit.
- (3) It is not used for the purpose of engaging in intrastate commerce.
- (4) It is not used for the purpose of commerce as defined in 49 C.F.R. 383.5, as amended.
- (5) It is not regulated by the public utilities commission pursuant to Chapter 4905., 4921., or 4923 of the Revised Code
  - (6) It is classed as one of the following:
- (a) "Travel trailer" means a non-self-propelled recreational vehicle that does not exceed an overall length of thirty-five (35) feet, exclusive of bumper and tongue or coupling, and contains less than three hundred twenty (320) square feet of space when erected on site. "Travel trailer" includes a tent-type fold-out camping trailer as defined in section 45.1.01 of the Revised Code.

- (b) "Motor home" means a self-propelled recreational vehicle that has not fifth wheel and is constructed with permanently installed facilities for cold storage, cooking and consuming of food, and for sleeping.
- (c) "Truck camper" means a non-self-propelled recreational vehicle that does not have wheels for road use and is designed to be placed upon and attached to a motor vehicle. "Truck camper" does not include truck covers that consist of walls and a roof, but do not have floors and facilities enabling them to be used as a dwelling.
- (d) "Fifth wheel trailer" means a vehicle that is of such size and weight as to be movable without a special highway permit, that has a gross trailer area of four hundred (400) square feet or less, that is constructed with a raised forward section that allows a bi-level floor plan, and that is designed to be towed by a vehicle equipped with a fifth-wheel hitch ordinarily installed in the bed of a truck.
- (e) "Park trailer" means a vehicle that is commonly known as a park model recreational vehicle, meets the American national standard institute standard A 119.5 (1988) for park trailers, is built on a single chassis, has a gross trailer area of four hundred (400) square feet or less when set up, is designed for seasonal or temporary living quarters, and may be connected to utilities necessary for the operation of installed features and appliances.
- **SECTION 2.** That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

**SECTION 3.** That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
