ORDINANCE NO. 49-2014

TITLE: AMEND THE MOVING OHIO FORWARD DEMOLITION PROGRAM

AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING FOR THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE MOVING OHIO FORWARD DEMOLITION PROGRAM AGREEMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Summit County, in conjunction with the State of Ohio Attorney General's Office (AGO), have implemented a "Phase II" of the Moving Ohio Forward (MOF) program in order to continue the removal of vacant, abandoned and blighted homes throughout the region; and

WHEREAS, both Summit County and the AGO are providing the City of Barberton with an additional One Hundred Forty One Thousand Seventy Two Dollars and No Cents (\$141,072.00) in unmatched abatement/demolition funding, with the provision that all funding by expended by September 30, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor or his designee to execute and deliver the Second Amended Agreement in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, together with such changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and shall not be adverse to the City, which approval shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution thereof by the Mayor or his designee.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that time is of the essence, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
