TITLE: ENTER INTO CONTRACT HENDERSON PRODUCTS INC. - STREETS

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BARBERTON TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH HENDERSON PRODUCTS INC. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$80,435 FOR THE PURCHASE, MANUFACTURING AND INSTALLATION OF A BODY PACKAGE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this truck body package is part of a truck build that will be added to the existing fleet in the Street Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Council hereby authorizes the City of Barberton to enter into contract with Henderson Products Inc. in the amount of Eighty Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Five Dollars and No Cents (\$80,435.00) for the purchase, manufacturing and installation of a body package, from Sourcewell who is a Cooperative Purchasing Consortium. By virtue of the Mayor's participation in the Ohio State Cooperative Purchasing Program and Ohio Revised Code, said purchase is hereby authorized to be made without competitive bidding.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, to allow for the order of the cab and chasses in a timely fashion to avoid delays, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
