ORDINANCE NO. 92-2014

TITLE: INCREASE OF CONTRACT – PERRIN ASPHALT

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF THE CONTRACT WITH PERRIN ASPHALT BY \$10,000, AS PART OF THE 2014 ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it was approved in Ordinance No. 58-2014 that the Mayor, or his designee, enter into contract with Perrin Asphalt in the amount of Two Hundred Seventy-One Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$271,774.25) for the 2014 Street Maintenance Program; and

WHEREAS, due to construction change orders relating to storm sewer improvements as part of the 2014 Roadway Improvement Program, an increase in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$10,000.00) in the original contract is needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Barberton, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That this Council hereby authorizes an increase in the amount of the original contract with Perrin Asphalt in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$10,000.00), totaling Two Hundred Eighty-One Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventy-Four Dollars and Twenty-Five Cents (\$281,774.25), due to construction change orders relating to storm sewer improvements as part of the 2014 Roadway Improvement Program.

SECTION 2. That it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and welfare of the City of Barberton and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that the increase in the amount of the contract is needed as quickly as possible in order to proceed with the projects in a timely manner, and provided it receives the necessary votes required by the City Charter, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
